Unite Colorado works with different agencies to build and scale a coordinated care network of health and social service providers. The goal of Unite Colorado is to address people's social needs and improve health across communities. Partners in the network are connected through Unite Us' shared technology platform. This technology keeps patient and client privacy protected and ensures systems of record across the community are seamlessly integrated.

With Unite Colorado we can track outcomes together, identify service gaps and at-risk population, and we can empower members of our community to take ownership of their own health. However, the networking available through this platform is only as strong as the number of organizations who participate. Joining the network is at no cost for community-based organizations and many organizations that are considered part of the safety net, like community health centers, tribal clinics, and mental health centers. Unite Us onboards and trains all partners who use the platform to ensure consistency, compliance, and accountability to the network. Zero Fare for Better Air

The Zero Fare for Better Air initiative we be held in June, July, and August of 2023. Transit agencies around the state will participate in the initiative to help reduce the ground level ozone by increasing the use of public transit. This initiative is made possible by Senate Bill 22-180 and the partnership of Colorado Association of Transit Agencies (CASTA) and the Colorado Energy Office (CEO).

In August of 2022, CASTA helped to implement a one-month pilot program of zero-fare transit across the state. Not only did this initiative led to an increase in ridership across all of the participating transit agencies, but it also helped to reduce Cardon Dioxide emissions, increased access to good and services and saved riders money on gas helping to further preserve the Colorado way of life. In just the month of August 2150 pounds of Carbon Dioxide were saved and \$435.35 in fuel was saved. There were fourteen agencies that participated in Free Fare August last year, and four of them were based out of Southeast Colorado. All four agencies from Southeastern Colorado reported an increase in ridership from August of 2021.

- * Bent County Transit reported a 10% increase in ridership.
- * La Junta Transit reported a 9% increase in ridership, along with seeing many new first-time riders.
- * Prowers Area Transit reported a 23% increase in ridership.

CASTA will be hosting an information webinar for potential applicants of the 2023 Ozone Season Transit Grant Program. Attending the webinar is mandatory if you are wishing to have your transit agency participate in the Zero Fare for Better Air initiative this year. The initial webinar was held on April 12, but they will conduct a second webinar on April 26th at 11:00am for anyone who was unable to attend the first webinar. During the webinar CASTA will provide information about the program, the grant application, documentation required to submit, and what to expect during the application process. National Transit News

2023 Federal Legislative Update

The week of March 20-24, 2023 Dawn Block and Ann Rajewski visited each delegation in Washington DC on behalf of CASTA. They were able to highlight rural transit in Colorado during their meetings, as well as mention some of the challenges Colorado transit agencies are being faced with. Additionally, Ann and Dawn were able to speak with them about the Congressionally Directed Spending projects submitted to the Senators and Representatives through CASTA's technical assistance process. They were also able to talk about the importance of maintaining the transit funding levels authorized in the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) in the pending appropriations process for transit agencies throughout the state. They were able to first-time meetings with many new staffers that were productive and went well. CASTA will now be setting up meetings with delegation staff in the local districts. Transit agency leaders will be invited to join the local meetings in order to give more specific updates. If you are interested in participating in your district meeting please let Ann know.
